Exhibit encourages Earth-friendliness

A traveling display about keeping our rivers clean will visit the Nashua Public Library for the month of January.

The three-station information-panel display was created by the Merrimack River Watershed Council and cosponsored by the Nevins Library in Methuen, Mass., through a grant obtained by the council. The display, which is being exhibited at libraries all along the Merrimack, shows how rainstorms and snowmelt cause runoff that picks up trash, fertilizer, oil, and other pollutants. This runoff ultimately makes its way into the river, a source of drinking water for 600,000 people.

Local residents can do their part to keep the river clean by creating green infrastructures like rain gardens and catch basins. Find out more about what you can do at "Gardening Your Way to a Clean Merrimack River" at the Nashua Public Library on January 10. See page 8 for more info.
